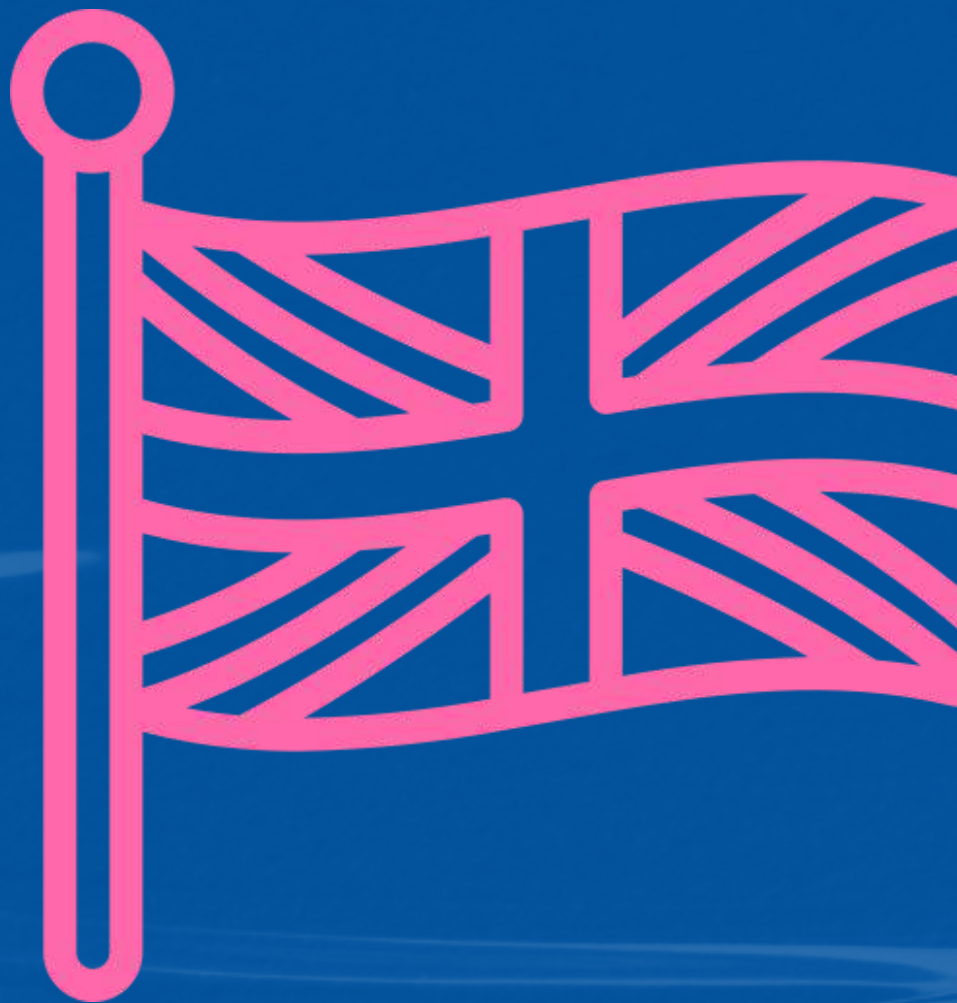

These influences may emanate from a variety of sources and media, including via the Internet, and at times students may may themselves reflecting or displaying views that may be discriminatory, prejudiced or extremist, including using derogatory language.

Any prejudice, discrimination, or extremist views, including derogatory language, displayed by students or staff will always be challenged and dealt with in line with the relevant policies on student behaviour and staff conduct.



# AS PART OF WIDER SAFEGUARDING RESPONSIBILITIES, STAFF WILL BE ALERT TO, AND HAVE A DUTY TO REPORT:



Graffiti symbols, writing or artwork promoting extremist messages or images.



Disclosures by students regarding their exposure to extremist actions, and/or views/materials, encountered outside school (such as in their homes or community groups).



Students accessing extremist material online, including through social networking sites.



Any reports of changes in behaviour, friendship or actions and requests for assistance.



Students voicing opinions drawn from extremist ideologies or narratives.



Use of extremist or "hate" terms to exclude others or incite violence.



Intolerance of difference, whether based on secular, religious, gender, disability, sexuality, race, colour, or cultural grounds.

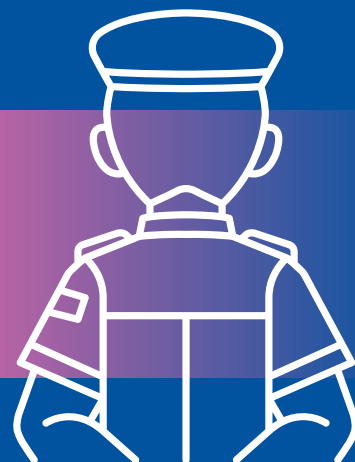


Attempts to impose extremist views or practices on others.



Anti-Western or Anti-British views.

In the first instance, reports of any of the above will be made to the DSL or DDSL.  
In extreme cases the police may need to be notified.



## IN ORDER TO HELP PREVENT SUCH OCCURRENCES, THE SCHOOL IS COMMITTED TO:



Raising staff and student awareness of radicalisation and extremism.



Working with local agencies and sharing information.



Maintaining robust ICT measures to prevent access to extremist or otherwise inappropriate websites.
